<p>Program Description: This program of study prepares students to become ophthalmic assistants who will work under the supervision of optometrists or ophthalmologists to provide patient care by performing many different eye- and vision-related clinical functions. Ophthalmic assistants take patient histories, perform the pre-testing and follow-up eye and vision examinations, provide patient education, and perform basic front office duties such as telephone triage and medical billing and coding.</p> <p>Upon graduation, ophthalmic assistants may work in optometry practices, ophthalmology practices; optical dispensaries; optical laboratories; health care and optical equipment businesses; lens, frame or contact lens companies; and pharmaceutical companies.</p> <p>The program courses are offered at the College's Northwest Regional Center with clinical experiences at The Eye Institute of Salus University and on-site in the OPH laboratory.</p>

Program Description:

The Optometric Assisting program at McFatter Technical College prepares students for a very rewarding career in Vision Care. Students learn the skills necessary to perform visual acuity, cover test, near point of convergence, pupil evaluation, stereopsis and much more. Optometric instruments learned include visual field analyzer, non-contact and rebound tonometry, corneal topography, fundus photography, auto-refractor and slit lamp.

Optometric Assisting students will learn optical dispensing skills including lensometry, verification, frame selection and eyeglass repair. Students also learn contact lens insertion and removal training and ordering. Front desk duties such as answering telephones and making appointment, patient records and using practice management software are also covered.

Students will get "hands-on" experience through the clinical externship program and the McFatter Vision Clinic, an on-campus site where the students work under supervision with a Florida-licensed optometric physician.
